The Cambridge Taverner Choir was formed in 1986 by Owen Rees and John Butt, and aims to give exciting and expressive performances of the glories of late mediaeval and renaissance polyphony - specialising particularly in music from the golden age of 16th century England, Spain and Portugal.

The members of the choir are mainly graduates (many exchoral scholars) of the University. Some still sing in Cambridge; others have moved to London where they sing professionally, or in amateur chamber choirs.

The choir has specialised in performing music in liturgical and architectural context - and indeed started life by singing a liturgical reconstruction of Taverner's beautiful mass, *Gloria Tibi Trinitas*, in Taverner's own church, the abbey at Tattershall, Lincolnshire. The choir has also worked closely with Mary Berry and her plainsong choir, *Scola Gregoriana*, in presenting liturgical reconstructions.

Owen Rees, the choir's musical director, was organ scholar at St Catharine's College from 1983 until 1986 and is currently completing his PhD thesis on 16th century Portuguese polyphony.
