CAMBRIDGE TAVERNER CHOIR

Since its first performance in 1986, the Cambridge Taverner Choir has established itself as one of the few specialist Renaissance choirs outside London. Although its performances and reputation have been concentrated in Cambridge, where it has given regular concerts in Jesus College Chapel and appeared in the Cambridge Festival, it has recently undertaken a tour of Portugal which culminated in a broadcast on BBC Radio 3, an extract from which was included in "Pick of the Week", and a feature on Radio 4's "Kaleidoscope".

Under the direction of its founder, Owen Rees, the Choir has successfully realised its vision of performing Renaissance polyphony in illuminating thematic, liturgical and physical contexts, aiming to recreate more fully the grandeur and excitement of the music of the Tudor age in England and the "Golden Age" of Spain and Portugal.

Most of the members of the Cambridge Taverner Choir have been choral scholars and choristers of Cambridge University; many have now moved to London, where they sing regularly in amateur and professional choirs. The Choir convenes in Cambridge several times a year, holding concentrated rehearsal weekends for each concert.

Music by Josquin, Gombert, Morales, Victoria, Lobo, Ramsey, Weelkes, Gibbons and Tomkins.

TAVERNER: WESTERN WYNDE MASS

We perform one of the most famous mass settings by the greatest English composer of the early sixteenth century, as well as Sheppard's grand Lenten antiphon, *Media Vita*, and works by a little-known Scottish contemporary, Robert Johnson.

Sunday 31 May, 8.15pm THE SONG OF SONGS

The Song of Solomon inspired much of the most vivid music and mystical writing in Renaissance Europe and particularly in Spain. We perform settings of this poem by the greatest Spanish masters of the period – Guerrero, Vivanco and Victoria – as well as those by their contemporaries in Italy.
